I would always like to give children an equal time on the pitch but it is sometimes difficult to exchange players equally, particularly if games are close. Help with transport is essential and would, therefore, be greatly appreciated. If you have arranged **PRIOR TO THE GAME** to transport someone else's child to the match, please indicate on the form below. Any children without transport to the venue on the day must be taken there by a member of staff to comply with our risk assessment. Should your child not be available, please let us know as soon as possible so we have time to find a replacement.

Venue and Timings:

Please arrive at Wreake Valley (LE7 1LY) and report to the 3G Football pitch where all the matches will take place. **Matches will commence at 3:45pm** so please arrive prior to this.

Parents and Spectators are welcome but they must stay behind the barrier on the side of the pitch or outside of the fence, they will not be allowed to be on the side line for each game.

We will aim to finish the competition by approx. **5:45pm**

Competition Information:

Fixtures will be handed out on the day

- It is the member of staff's responsibility to ensure their team are on the correct pitch and ready to start their matches.
- You are responsible for your pupils whilst they are at the competition at all times, including first aid.

Format:

- Due to the high volume of teams we will be playing **5 a-side matches**
- Subs can roll-on and roll-off
- Although it is a Boys competition, Girls can play if needed.
- There will be two groups.
- Points will be awarded for group matches (3pts for a win, 1pt for a draw 0pts for a loss)
- The highest placed team from each group will play a cross over final to determine the overall winner (If teams can't be separated by points, head to head, then goal difference and finally goals scored will be the deciding factors)
- All players **must wear shin pads**
- **Suitable footwear/boots must be worn**, no player will be allowed to play if they are wearing blades.
