Can parents and carers please control children when walking them into or out of school. Residents have said that they are often left to run across the driveways without any care or attention to cars coming in and out. The residents do pay special attention to this, but we would like to remind parents to minimise any risk.

Beeby Road is quite narrow as it leads into the village. Residents are also having difficulty exiting their drives when cars are parked overhanging the entrances which leaves little room to pull out and turn.
