

OVERVIEW...



Hi, hope you are all looking after each other! Weird times! Just some further clarification on the work that has been set for Class 4.

Expectations:

1. Books should still be as neat as possible. Those who have a pen licence may use one as long as the pen is of good quality – not biros. The expectations of the non-negotiables are the same as ever – title and date (underlined); learning objective written out neatly on EVERY piece of work
2. Try to do some maths, English and topic each day. Don't let the children 'cherry-pick' their favourite bits but a balance of activities is good. They must complete a mymaths activity and an English activity each day plus two topic pieces if possible. Try to complete all topic work by the end of the week, depending upon ability and circumstances. There are lots of extra activities and extensions for the eager / bored!
3. The **obligatory** work each week is mymaths, the English work and the main topic work. This work will be marked regularly and feedback given so it would be appreciated if I could receive a photo of completed English and topic work by email by the end of each week. Typed work is acceptable as long as it is also printed and neatly stuck into their books. Obviously the children have different abilities and will require different amounts of support / time. The target maths pages are there should they be useful and an answer booklet is enclosed in your pack. These pages can be self-marked.
4. The work is in line with what they would be doing were they still in school so please encourage them to complete it despite the temptations of being at home. We need, particularly with the Year 5s, to maintain the discipline they will need next year and any missed work will equate to potentially unrecoverable gaps in their education.

Undoubtedly, there may be glitches due to this unprecedented situation but I am sure we will work together to ensure that the children's education is as uninterrupted as possible. To be honest, it offers some interesting opportunities for the children to learn in their home environment... Looking forward to seeing you all when this is all over! Stay healthy!
